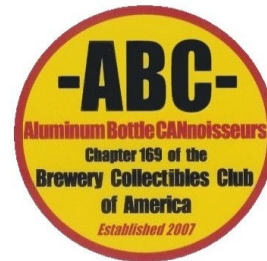

### Renewal Dues Cycle and Rates:

We start our renewal dues process this September and October. Unless something unexpected happens at our chapter meeting at CANvention, the dues will again be \$5 per year plus \$10 for land delivery in the US and actual postage for land delivery outside the US. Renewal dues can be paid at CANvention or can be mailed after CANvention. Payment can also be made by PayPal with an extra 10% fee for transactions outside of the US.

## Exal Corporation wins high Quality Award for aluminum beer bottle

The container Exal developed for Boulevard Brewing's Unfiltered Wheat Beer was the only aluminum bottle package to be honored at the IMDA Annual Convention held in Chicago on May 20 - 23 of this year.

Unique in its innovative design and bold graphics, the container is a recyclable aluminum bottle that features a distinct neck profile topped with crown finish, a closure initially used exclusively with glass. *Boulevard Brewing Unfiltered Wheat Beer* is the first brewing product in the world to be packaged in Exal's new 66mm impact-extruded aluminum beer bottle.

Started in 1933, the IMDA is a trade organization that encourages improvement and advancement in the art of metal decorating and in the industrial progress of the metal decorating trade. The organization boasts membership from over 30 countries and is recognized as the global leader in metal decorating advocacy and annually recognizes outstanding achievement in the area of metal decorating.

# A variation or not... (Caps)

With the recent change of almost all the caps (aka Crowns) on the Anheuser Busch bottles I figured it was time to write up an article and try to keep things straight. There have been several changes through the years along with a few special edition and commemorative caps. I have taken it upon myself to name caps, as you'll see below the pictures. The reason I'm doing this is I would eventually like to have a 3 letter abbreviation to identify each cap on the AB bottle listing. (i.e. Budweiser 'Red Crown' bottles would be BRC on the listing), like I do with my own listings.

Do caps even qualify as a variation? Well, some may say no and could care less which cap is on the bottle, if one at all. Then there are those who live and die by the variations. You make the choice, that's why I call these articles 'A variation or not...'

The first Budweiser bottles released were the 'Black Neck' variations and all those bottles will have a 'Black Crown' cap.

These were released in early 2005 and ran for a few months until the 'Red Neck' Budweiser bottles came out. Now this is where it can get tricky. The early 'Red Neck' bottles were capped with the 'Black Crowns' and later in the year they switched over to the 'Red Crown' caps. The 'Red Crowns' were a very short lived crown as in the spring of 2006 the caps again changed to the 'Bowtie'. This made for a variation collecting nightmare since now we have three different bottles that may have one of three different caps.

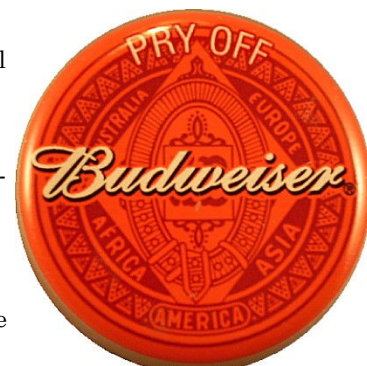
The best way to know if you're getting a 'Red Neck' bottle with the right cap is to remember BBC up to fall of 05, BRC fall 05 to early 06 and BBT 06 and on. Numbers on the 'Red Necks' are 500357, 8 and 9.

The Budweiser 'Bowtie' cap remained the main cap for all Bud bottles up until just recently. In late March/early April the Budweiser caps started to change over to the 'World Cap'. This unfortunately happened at a bad time as it was right in the middle of the baseball bottle releases. It has proven to be somewhat of a pain as now the hardcore variation collectors could be looking for double the amount of baseball Budweiser bottles. I personally had to draw the line and stick with going for just the national releases.

Budweiser only had a one special edition when they put the 'Daytona' (red w/black rim) caps on the Daytona bottles back in 2007. The 'Bud Cap' can be found on Argentina and Ireland export bottles.

Bud Select has made it real easy for me. There has been one cap for all Bud Selects released to date. The Bud Select 'Black' cap has just the roughly drawn red crown on a solid black cap. Not a whole lot for the variation collectors here.

Bud Light, unlike Budweiser remained unchanged from the first in 2005 until just recently. The first caps, which I have dubbed Bud Light 'First', since it is technically the first and I might run out of letters the way they keep adding special editions, were changed over at the same time as the Budweiser caps. The newer caps, Bud Light 'Second', started to show up in late March/early April. Again this happened in the middle of the baseball release so you may find BL1 or BL2 on any of the 09 baseball bottles.

Bud Light leads the pack when it comes to putting out special edition caps. The Bud Light 'Orange' cap was used on both years of the Halloween bottles, the 'Orange' bottle and the 'Hooters' bottle.

The Bud Light 'Dark Green' was on the first two years of the 'St Patrick's' Day bottles. Then AB changed it up a little and put Bud Light 'Pale Green' caps on the 2008 and 2009 'St Patrick's' Day bottles. They also used the 'Pale Green' caps for the 'Celtics' championship bottles.

A few other Bud Light caps to mention are the 'Royal Caribbean' (blue/yellow) for the RCCL bottles, the Philadelphia 'Eagles' (Eagle green) and the Pittsburgh 'Steelers' (black/yellow) for the 2007 NFL bottle release.

Bud Light Lime just appeared in aluminum bottles about a year ago. The 'Pale' caps were on the first releases and ran until June 09. The 'Dark' caps just started to appear on the bottles and are definitely a crisper looking cap. The new 'Dark' caps were rumored to be why they changed the GAN number on the bottles. Not true, the cap on the bottle in no way influences the bottle number. See my regular column for info on the new Bud Light Lime bottle.

Michelob and Michelob Light were among the very first AB aluminum bottles to appear. The caps remained the same throughout the bottles run from 2004 until they were dropped last year. Since the bottles didn't under go very significant changes, the Michelob Beer Cap and Michelob Light Cap were easy to keep up with.

Michelob Ultra Amber has also faded from the aluminum bottle scene. They also had just one cap which appeared on the few variations that were released.

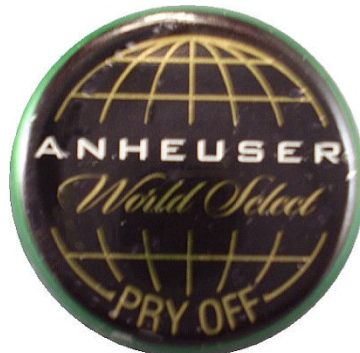

Michelob Ultra is the only remaining member of the Michelob family still being put in aluminum bottles. The bottles themselves underwent a change late last year to the blue/white design. The Michelob Ultra 'Blue' caps remained the only cap until the Michelob Ultra 'White' caps appeared back in the winter.

The very first beer to appear in AB aluminum bottles was World Select. The early World Select bottles are some of the toughest to find, one can say the same for the caps also. The World Select

'Green' cap was used on the four variations of World Select.

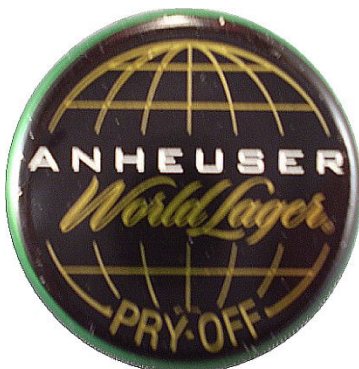


World Select 'Green' WSG

Right after Bud Select was introduced AB decided to change World Select to World Lager. May have been to help prevent confusion when someone yells across the bar "Another Select over here..." Anyway the early World Lager 'Green' caps appeared on all three variations of the World Lagers. The World Lager 'Black' cap was used on the 500273 version and appeared towards the end of the run for World Lager in 2006.

# What's New

## Jerome (Spinney) Spindler ABC# 006

Hi, I hope everyone is enjoying the Summer, drinking plenty of beer and staying hydrated, so much for my medical degree.

Well for new bottles out there this time around we have two from Surgenor Brewing Company in Comox Valley on beautiful Vancouver Island, Canada. The First one is Red House Ale, I'm guessing it got its name from the red building in which it is brewed. The second beer is Steam Donkey Lager. It got its name from lumber jacks that used steam powered winch to get logs out of the forest. The winch was invented in 1881 and later retired when internal combustion engines came along. That is how they came up with the term Steam Donkey.

The owners of the brewery are relatives of Robert Surgenor who immigrated from northern Ireland in 1837. Robert always passed down a saying which was 'DO EVERYTHING AS IF IT WERE THE LAST THING YOU DO'. Today the owners of the brewery still go by the saying. They try and reflect this in their brews. Red House is an intense amber color with a full flavored body, overtaken by a citrusy hop character and a fine floral aroma, this ale is pleasant and thirst quenching-yet deceptively complex. Steam Donkey is richly colored with a full malt flavor and orangey sweetness that lends well to the smooth mouth feel. The aromatic notes spiciness are the perfected to a swig of our perfect beer, a truly refreshing experience. Steam Donkey Lager is referred to as a working beer with a dash of west coast history and is fashioned after the traditional Czech Pilsner light straw to golden color and crystal clear. Hops are very prevalent usually with a spicy floral flavor and aroma. notably one of the defining characteristics of the saaz hop. Smooth and clean with a smooth malt palate..

### THE SPANISH ARMY

For many years, tennis in Spain has been very well promoted. From Manolo Santana back in the 70's to the actual superstar Rafael Nadal, a lot of players like the Sanchez Vicario brothers, Carlos Moya, Juan Carlos Ferrero, Fernando Verdasco, and Manuel Orantes, among other famous names, when appearing in tournaments, were known as "The Spanish Army". I couldn't find a better name than that one, to identify the entire bottles collection from the European peninsula. They all have a common detail: they present excellent designs, good taste on features, permanent issuing, and a capacity of (33 cl).

They are so attractive that I found many collectors worldwide extremely interested to have them all on their collections. I will not stop on details for old pieces, because they were quite well introduced a few magazines ago, but take a look to the new Estrella Damm "Eye", typical production of Catalan's artistry, maybe better in an art gallery than refrigerators.

Estrella Levante ended 2008 with “Un Tercio”, in my opinion a new type of massive communication with a clear message on body without any special designing.

San Miguel broke any kind of expectation, producing one spectacular set of 4 cabottles representing Catalan’s mosaics, from old traditional ceramists. They are very hard to find because just a few sets were made. San Miguel was very busy and trusted the new shape producing a model for the ATP Tennis Open of Barcelona, for the basketballs teams Joventut de Badalona (Catalunya), Tau Cerámica (Basko country), and soccer club Málaga. And finally the new member of San Miguel-Mahou group answered the Madrileños expectation, both youngsters and not so young, with the “2009 Rock Concerts” and the most popular soccer clubs Atlético and Real Madrid. All are little jewels.

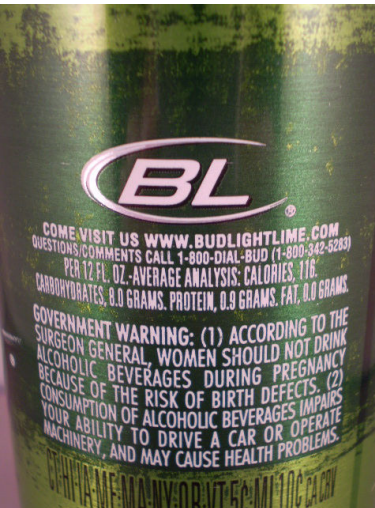

There was a problem with the design, then a redesign was done and it was getting too late in the season so they scrapped them. Also the non-redemptions for both Yanks and Mets bottles haven't appeared yet. Not sure on that one, but not looking good as no one in the usual release areas have seen anything but the redemptions.

Please read my article on caps for more info on the new Bud and Bud Light caps now being used. Other than one new bottle, that's about the only action on the aluminum bottles. New caps have been confirmed on both the Budweiser and Bud Light national releases. The baseball releases could prove to be a nightmare to confirm on all the bottles. One will have to assume that not all the baseballs had both caps since some were released later. I had a hard enough time just getting one of each as it is...

The one new release to make note of is Bud Light Lime. It's a minor variation change, added the website info to the back panel. It was rumored that the new cap was the reason for the new bottle number. As I mentioned back in my other article, totally false. The bottles are manufactured by Exal while most of the AB caps come from Eagle Packaging. You may find the old version, 501287/8, of this bottle with the newer caps and visa-versa. Just depends on when they were capped and which caps were in the hopper at the time.

Till next time and we can only hope that since there will not be any football aluminum bottles, maybe we'll see some new Holiday releases this fall?
