Obscure Law Makes Aluminum Beer Bottles Illegal

Earth-friendly New Yorkers that drink beer at sporting events out of aluminum bottles are not only likely to yell at someone before the night is over, they also happen to be breaking the law. According to an obscure 1982 law, called The Bottle Law, aluminum bottles are technically illegal in New York.

The crime is actually all in the caps. The Bottle Law came into effect to prevent the use of pull tab cans, because those tabs present a danger to animals who would choke on them once they were discarded. Any bottle metal beverage container that didn't come with an attached lid was outlawed. Aluminum bottles were introduced later as an answer; they're also easy to recycle and refrigeration units use less energy to keep them cold.

Apparently, even state lawmakers were unaware of the Bottle Law until beer industry execs approached them recently about changing it. As of now, the amendment awaits Governor Cuomo's signature before it becomes official.

Perhaps once the Governor gets this signed finding aluminum bottles in New York state will be a little easier. Never knew collecting could lead criminal activities....

New to this year's baseball teams come the Detroit Tigers, again, a very sharp redemption bottle 839373.


New cabottles are not as prevalent as they once were, but outside of the United States designs are getting better, more stylish and attractive. These examples prove that to be the absolute truth.

DESPERADOS - France: Slowly but steadily, the famous French beer with tequila is finding their identity with these 330ml bottles especially this example of the "Hors Serie 2011" produced by Brasserie "Fischer."

This edition features a sober contrast to the multicolored variation that preceded it.



SAN MIGUEL - Spain: No rest for Spanish designers. Continuing the tradition to launch limited edition commemoratives give us the "Love Surf" and "Sella", which retain a familiar style to its predecessors. The increasing production of bottles from Spain is getting close to putting them second only to the United




the super-limited editions are known for. The artistic quality of its design goes hand in hand with the quality of its content.



JJ DE WEERT - The Netherlands: The "Augustinus 1" is the first to appear on the Dutch market after "Stella Artois", who were the only producers in aluminum bottles for a while. It seemed odd that Holland's historic brewing tradition wouldn't have several cabottles on market, so we celebrate the appearance of this beautiful bottle, and wish that other cabottles come to increase the flow of Dutch production.

ALFA - Netherlands: Almost by chance, while featuring the JJ de Weert, one of the oldest brewers in the Netherlands was seduced by these new types of containers. Luckily they decided to give them a run so we now have this beautiful example. Almost certainly other breweries will enter the market for aluminum bottles as the price of the material has dropped sharply.

What's New in A-B?!

We were pleasantly surprised to see the Bud Light 'UFC' for Canada released earlier this year. They wasted no time in following up with a US version. Real similar to the Canadian version with Spanish writing on one side.

With both the NHL and NBA Championships wrapping up at about the same time, AB graced us with two new bottles. A Bud Light for the Boston Bruins Stanley Cup Championship and a Budweiser for the Dallas Mavericks NBA Championship. Both bottles are the usual limited release around their perspective cities.

So far, the only thing we're seeing in baseball bottles is the usual All-Star Game bottle. This year in Arizona. Bottle is extremely close to last years design with a small Diamondbacks logo above All-Star Game.

Bud Light Lime up in Canada has given us a totally new design. Logos are smaller on the bottle and the silver has been replaced with green. No news on whether or not the US versions will follow suit, would be nice though.

Out of nowhere a new Budweiser bottle for China has shown up. Other than a different GAN and some changes to the back panel, almost exactly the same as the bottle released back in 2006.

Finally we have discovered another sleeper, this one from the UK. A 330ml silver Budweiser bottle manufactured back in 2003. This prototype bottle has no back panel, thus no UPC or mandatory's listed. Bottle was never capped and is very limited as just a few were passed around among AB execs while they decided not to go with them. GAN number is 505704 and this sure would be a nice one to pull out of a dollar box (in my dreams...).

Killebrew now in Aluminum Bottles



Killebrew Root Beer is hitting it out of the park this year, though partially due to sad news.

The May 17 death of legendary Twins slugger Harmon Killebrew has helped boost demand for Killebrew Root Beer and Killebrew Cream Soda by 400 percent in 2011 compared to last year, said Jim Lundeen, who owns Ramsey-based RJM Distributing, which makes the brew.

Lundeen wants to be respectful of Killebrew's legacy and not let it appear that he's trying to capitalize on his death. However, he also realizes that there's a spotlight on the product and a spike in sales, and the company's challenge is to keep the brand growing. It's a task that Lundeen says is doable and has been in the works since his company acquired the brand more than a year ago. "I think that we're going to be OK. Time will tell. Sales continue to improve."

Killebrew Root Beer was founded in 1996 by Harmon's son, Kenny Killebrew. The legend for why it started varies, but supposedly Killebrew's grandfather home-brewed root beer when Harmon was a child and Harmon loved the soft drink.

The brand had a loyal following, but languished because it was such a small operation. It was in and out of several retail chains over the years, and it went through a handful of different contract manufacturers and distributors.

In its second season with the Twins, Killebrew Root Beer is still a high-demand product at Target Field, said Pete Spike, general manager of Delaware North Cos. Sportservice, which operates concessions at the stadium.

Guinness in Aluminum Bottles?!

Sorry to get your hopes up but Guinness actually does not have an aluminum beer bottle.

But I did come across this really neat design for an aluminum bottle for the venerable Irish beer by someone named Julien Muller. The angular shape is quite different from most aluminum beer bottle designs which are rounded. The design is part of a project by Muller called "Prism, Stripes & Diamond bottles".

The malleability of aluminum would probably make this non-traditional design feasible. The Guinness "brand police" would probably not allow any bottle not to have their iconic Guinness logo. But theirs is a dark logo and would probably blend easily with Muller's design.

It's wonderful how aluminum bottles have become the new canvasses for today's artists and designers. And who knows, maybe we'll see Guinness in an aluminum bottle yet.
